#1

movement of military equipment in Crimea

On March 5, separate military trucks were spotted in the direction from Feodosia to Dzhankoy. At 00.00 Kyiv time, a column of about 40 tanks was moving towards Dzhankoy.

#2

traitors of the oath found

According to the Security Service of Ukraine, the broken column of enemy troops near Mykolaiv consisted of the Russian military from Crimea who in 2014 having betrayed the oath to serve Ukraine joined the occupant.

#3

Crimean hospitals overwhelmed with wounded Russian soldiers

The Sevastopol hospital is currently overwhelmed, and it is reported that new severely wounded Russian servicemen are expected. Hospitals in Armyansk, Krasnoperekopsk and Dzhankoy are overwhelmed with the wounded. There are approximately 1,000-1,500 wounded in each of them. These hospitals accept only the military, civilians are forced to turn to either private clinics or go to Simferopol.

#4

Stench in the north of Crimea

On the first day of the invasion on February 24 in the north of Crimea, there was a roar and stench. Many people left for Simferopol, half of the population of Armiansk have not yet returned.

#5

population used as a human shield

On February 24, the occupants set up missile launchers in the courtyards of private homes to prevent the Ukrainian military from shelling it as it would not target civilians.

#6

no longer eager to go to war

Most of the Russian servicemen in Ukrainian hospitals have no idea how to continue fighting and do not want to take part in the war.

#7

new wave of repression

The Russian invasion of Ukraine caused a new wave of repression in occupied Crimea. Crimeans are receiving some (rare for now) invitations for "talks" from the Russian FSB.

11 Among Russian prisoners of war taken by Ukraine, 11 are from Crimea
